This week's Article focusses:

- Article 13 - Every child must be free to express their thoughts and opinions and to access all kinds of information, as long as it is within the law.
- Article 16 (right to privacy) - Every child has the right to privacy. The law should protect the child's private, family and home life, including protecting children from unlawful attacks that harm their reputation.
- Article 17 - Every child has the right to reliable information from a variety of sources, and governments should encourage the media to provide information that children can understand. Governments must help protect children from materials that could harm them.

This week's assembly focus surrounded the work that the children produced on 'Safer Internet Day' on the last week of term. Year 5 led the assembly, reading their E-Safety picture books which they created and also playing their E-Safety videos.

As a school, the children then discussed the key things that they could do to make sure that they stay safe online. Below are some of their suggestions:

1. *Keep your personal information private*
2. *Listen to age restrictions*
3. *Make sure that you tell an adult if someone isn't being kind*
4. *Block people and report people who are unkind or rude*
5. *Don't share pictures without permission*
6. *Make sure that you are kind to other people online*
7. *Don't talk to strangers online*
