Article Focus:

Article 27 (right to an adequate standard of living) - Every child has the right to a standard of living that is good enough to meet their physical and social needs and support their development. Governments must help families who cannot afford to provide this.

Article 13 (freedom of expression) - Every child must be free to express their thoughts and opinions and to access all kinds of information, as long as it is within the law.

This week, the steering group visited VIPS at Kings Hill to support them in creating their playground charter. The children shared how we generated our charter at Leybourne Chase by meeting with Mid-Day Meal Supervisors to discuss both what is working and what can be developed. The children then used this to come up with rights respecting actions that both adults and children can and should demonstrate on the playground to ensure that rights are being met. This was a fantastic opportunity for the children to share their understanding of rights and how to ensure that the whole school ethos is centered around children's rights. Thank you to Kings Hill for showing us around your lovely school and well done to the steering group for being such fantastic ambassadors for children's rights.
