



Rights Respecting School Award

This week's Article focusses:

- Article 13 - Every child must be free to express their thoughts and opinions and to access all kinds of information, as long as it is within the law.
- Article 16 (right to privacy) - Every child has the right to privacy. The law should protect the child's private, family and home life, including protecting children from unlawful attacks that harm their reputation.
- Article 17 - Every child has the right to reliable information from a variety of sources, and governments should encourage the media to provide information that children can understand. Governments must help protect children from materials that could harm them.

On Tuesday this week, VIPs at Leybourne Chase took part in Safer Internet Day. **Safer Internet Day** is celebrated globally in February each year to promote the **safe** and positive use of digital technology for children and young people, and the campaign sees over 1,600 organisations unite to raise awareness of online safety issues and run events and activities right across the UK.

Across the school, the children took part in a range of activities and discussions to explore how they can make sure that they are safe and responsible online. Some of these activities included:

- Taking part in an E-Safety quiz
- Creating their own E-Safety picture books
- Exploring different videos and stories
- Taking part in drama activities
- Producing presentations sharing information about E-Safety

At the end of the day, parents were invited in to school, for the children to share their learning with them.
